

Range Rules

- 1.** All Federal, Provincial and Municipal Laws and Regulations must be followed while on range Property.
- 2.** No person impaired by alcohol or drugs shall be permitted to handle or discharge firearms on the range property.
- 3.** Ranges are for use by members and invited guests only. Members shall be responsible for ensuring that their guests are aware of the range rules and supervise their actions.
- 4.** Members AND Guests MUST be signed in at the Gatehouse and members MUST carry their current club ID card on their person as proof of membership. Any person without proof of membership will be asked to leave the range.
- 5.** When on any bay, all shooters and spectators must wear ear and eye protection at all times.
- 6.** No horseplay and No careless handling of firearms or any distraction while shooting is in progress.
- 7.** When more than one shooter is on the firing line of any bay, appoint a range officer. The range officer shall give the commands to "commence fire" and "cease fire". The range officer shall also be responsible for ensuring firearms are unloaded during a cease fire and that no firearms are handled while any person is down range.
- 8.** No shooter shall handle a firearm during a cease fire or while others are down range.
- 9.** All firearms placed on the firing line bench shall have actions open until ready to fire.
- 10.** Keep the muzzle direction down range at all times and under your control.
- 11.** Firearms are to be unloaded and completely clear of all ammunition coming to and from the firing line.
- 12.** Any firearms requiring maintenance shall be unloaded, removed from the firing line to a designated safe area.

13. Targets

- Binary or exploding targets are prohibited.
- Shoot only targets that have been approved by the range.
- Use provided target stands only.
- Do not move fabricated target stands
- Do not fire at any targets directly on the ground.
- Shooters on ranges 100 meters or longer shall only use target holders erected by the range.
- All metal targets must be reactive (they must move or fall down) and must be positioned at right angles to the firing line.
- Do not shoot pistol steel targets closer than 10meters and do not shoot rifle steel closer than 100 meters. Steel on the rimfire bay is lighter and for 22 rimfire only.
- Do not shoot pistol steel targets with any high caliber or magnum handgun and do not shoot pistol steel with centerfire rifle except Pistol Caliber Carbine.
